

William Self Associates, Inc. Scholarship

SOURCE: William Self Associates, Inc., a private consulting company in archaeology and historic preservation, has established a scholarship to support graduate research for archaeology students enrolled in the Department of Anthropology at the University of Arizona.

ELIGIBILITY: There are no restrictions on who can receive the award other than that students must be enrolled in the graduate program in anthropology at the University of Arizona, with a concentration on Southwestern archaeology. Research may be on any topic, but preference will be given to those focusing on the archaeology of the Hohokam region.

SELECTION PROCESS: The scholarship will be awarded on an annual basis. The William Self Associates Scholarship will be selected by the Southwest Land, Culture, and Society (SWLCS) Program and its Executive Committee. Funds may be used for any research related expenses, including living expenses, specialized analyses, and travel to conferences. Students should submit a one-page proposal, due February 15th, that will include the following:

- a. Curriculum vitae
- b. A one page statement summarizing the proposed research
- c. Two letters of support
- d. Detailed budget

The SWLCS Executive Committee will evaluate and rank proposals by March 1st. One award will be made each year. Student research interests (i.e. settlement patterns, geoarchaeology, mortuary practices, ceramics etc.) will rotate on an annual basis. Funds should be expended within one year of the award and a final project report submitted to the SWLCS Program and to William Self Associates, Inc. by March 1st of the year following the award. It is also expected that the research funds will contribute to a thesis, dissertation, or publishable paper. Acknowledgment of the award should be listed in all publications or presentations that result from the research.
